



- Service users and staff receive training to allow them to feel confident to deliver a course
- 5. Courses are available to service users, staff and carers
- 6. Information about Recovery College is provided to carers on a regular basis
- There are regular events/ Recovery College forums open to all to keep momentum going
- 8. There are clear ways in which courses are evaluated
- 9. There are outcome measures in place for Recovery College
- 10. There are clear links to local community based Recovery Colleges/

We have had two family and friends events – Easter afternoon, tea and summer barbecue
Leaflets were given to carers at the BBQ to promote the recovery college. Skills that were learnt at recovery college were demonstrated at family events.

Feedback forms sent to carers.

Being in touch with Clifton House we could link up community courses. Because we are near each other. Run courses at both hospitals – a joint open day, joint graduation. Aiming to improve awareness with poster points and regular community meetings attended by recovery lead. It is available to staff but we have never had a staff member complete the course due to staffing or shift.
