- \* Course prospectus and easy-read guides for in-patient areas have been produced
- \*The College operates from in-patient and community campuses
- \*The courses vary in length some may be a single one hour session, whereas other courses may be weekly for set period and others ongoing. Each course would not usually be run more than once a week




#### Student Feedback-

Who is in our STP?

\* increasing co-facilitation to 100%

- \* establishing community links

#### **Ideas for Triggers**

 Outcomes - qualitative, not quantitative - self-worth, confidence, values, - service users in rehab

2 – Carers Event planning for own service, eg forum and deliver course
Pop up weekends
Peer support meeting with STP

3 - ?Filming courses eg Youtube style - virtual Catalogue of course to exchange – standardise courses ?help with accreditation

4 – STP Workshop – develop model of 6 production "bank" EXE for STP
