The next meeting in March will expand on these plans and think about how we can continue to engage with you all to shape the future plans in Humber Coast and Vale. Until next time...

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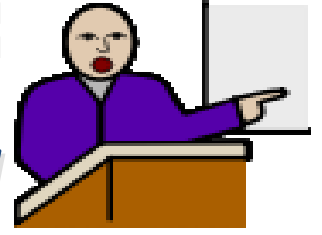
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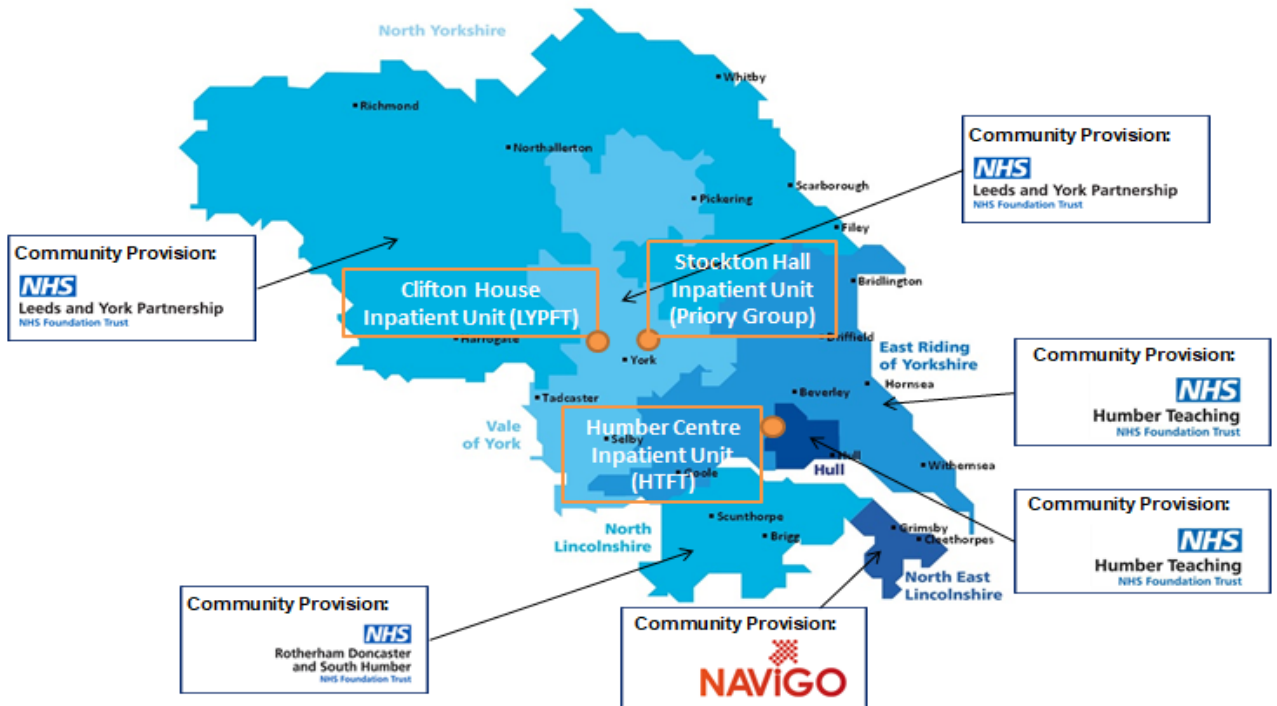

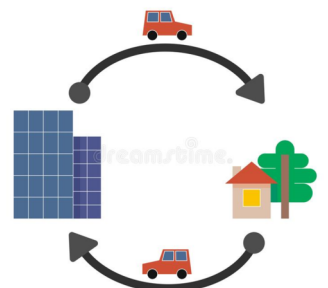
The Humber Coast and Vale Provider Collaborative

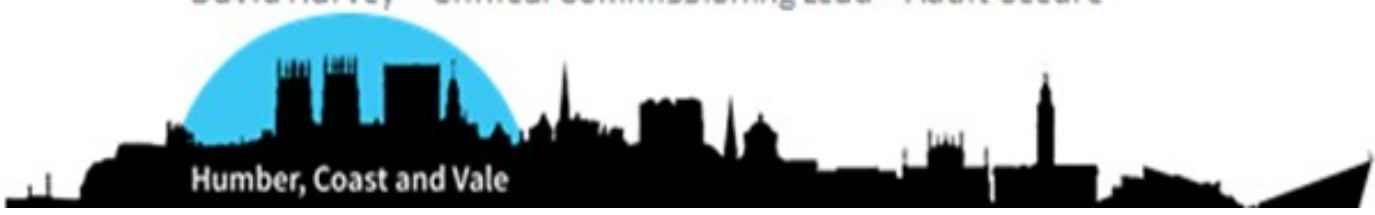

Logo Competition



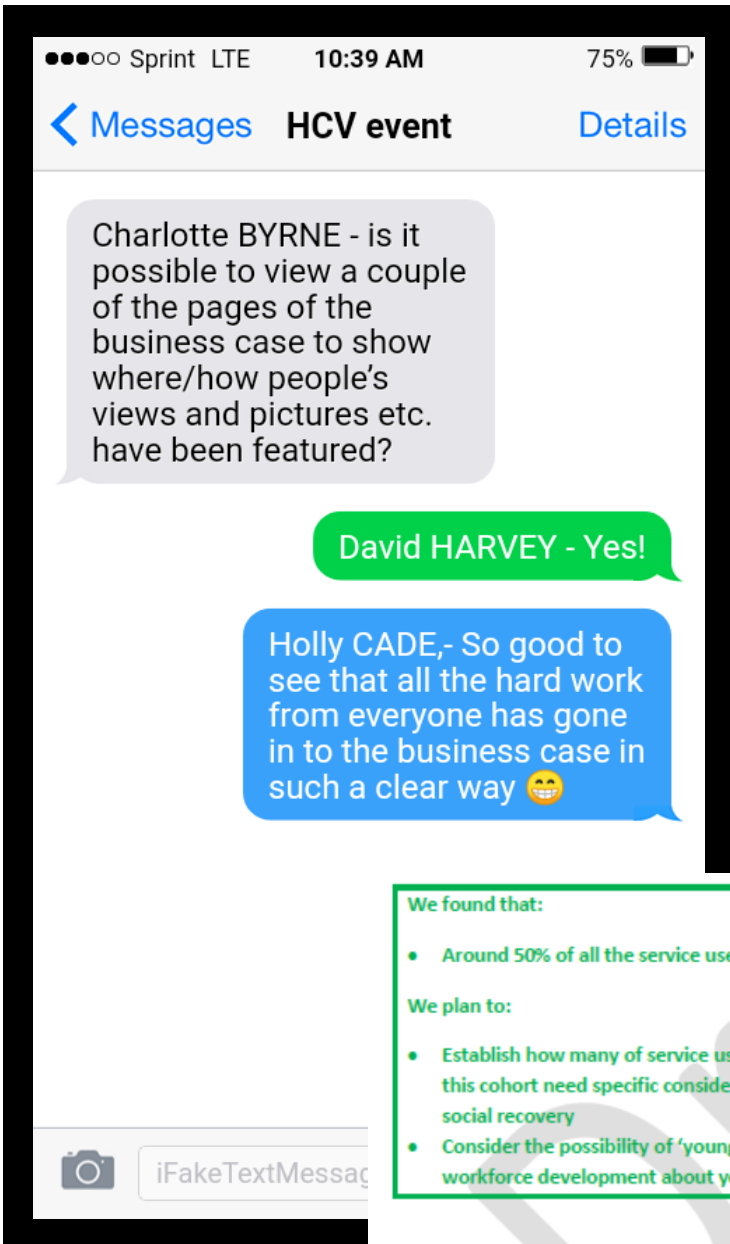
What is the provider collaborative?
The provider collaborative is the partnership between all mental health services in this region that are working to bring together those responsible for commissioning ("buying") and those providing mental health services, to create care pathways that are person-centred and built around the needs of individuals regardless of which organisation is responsible for each element of that person's journey.

What does the provider collaborative want to see next?
The provider collaborative wants to be friendly and mean something to the people who are under its care. It wants to be personal to the region (as there are lots of provider collaborations forming across the country).

What should the logo be?
A logo is a small image or symbol that makes something easily identifiable: the logos in need to represent your region and be easily recognised as belonging to that region. It may include words that mean something too. Examples include...

What is a strapline?
A heading or caption to go with your logo is important to grab people's attention - it is a few words that say what the provider collaborative are trying to do.

Designs will be sent to the provider collaborative board where one will be chosen as the winner!

Holly CADE,- So good to see that all the hard work from everyone has gone in to the business case in such a clear way 😊

- We found that:**
- Just under half of all HCV service users are currently cared for away from home/Out of Area (OOA)
- Service users have told us that:**
- Being far away from home is very unhelpful - we miss family and it is hard to maintain our relationship with them
 - Being closer to home is helpful for discharge planning and to help us keep hope and connections with community teams and family
- We plan to:**
- Develop clear system of oversight, support and accountability to ensure people get the right treatment as close to home as possible

- We found that:**
- Around 50% of all the service users in secure care are under the age of 35
- We plan to:**
- Establish how many of service users are under 25 and so fall into the 'young adult' category - this cohort need specific considerations in terms of clinical intervention, risk management and social recovery
 - Consider the possibility of 'young person centred' provision or work streams, such as workforce development about young adults and risk/offending/mental health/development?

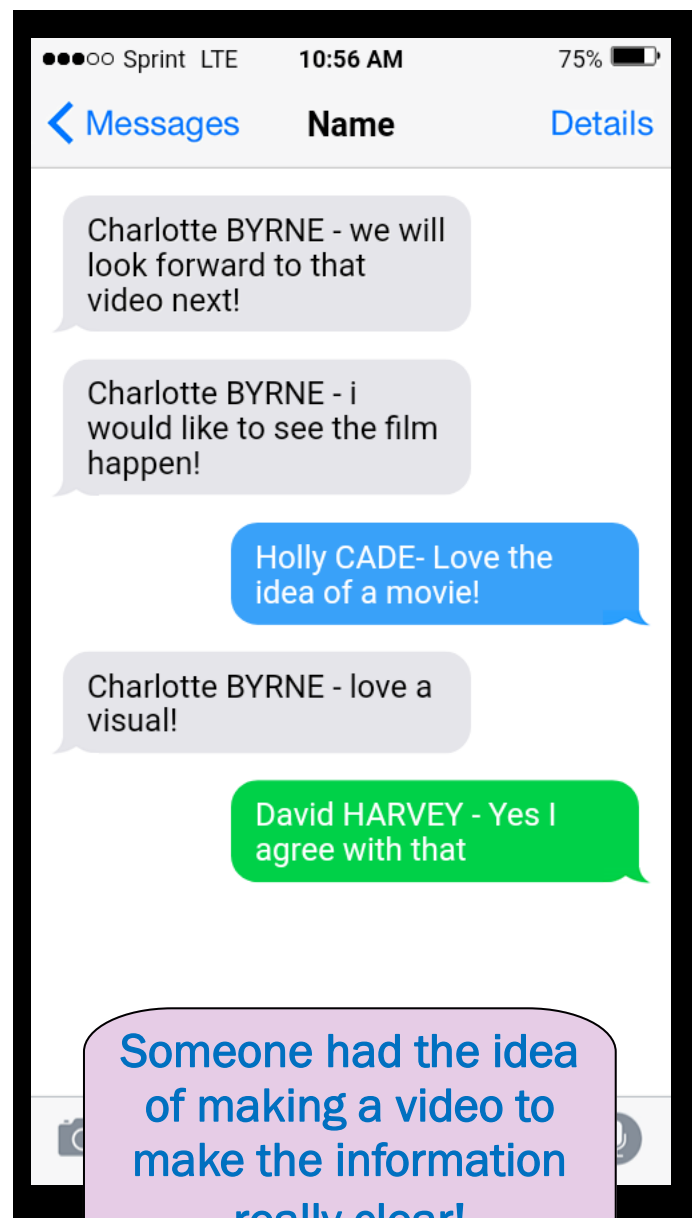
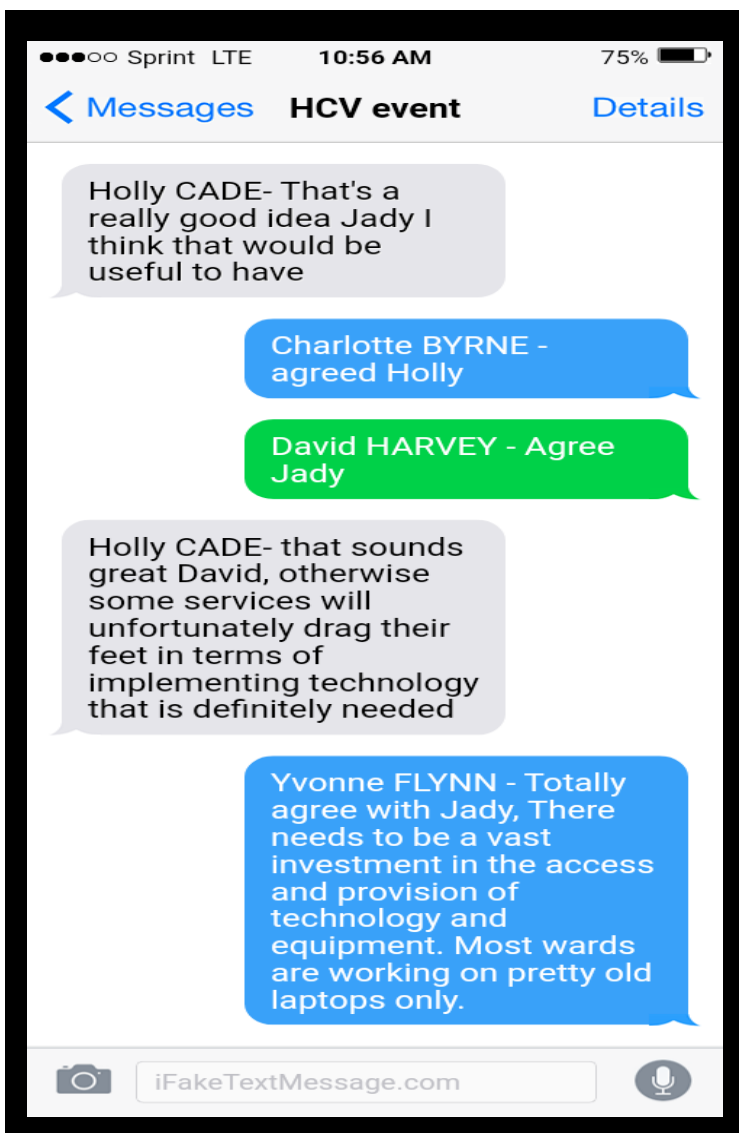

Humber Coast and Vale

The country has been split into geographical areas. This is either the area of the country that you are getting care and treatment in at the moment or the area that you are from originally.

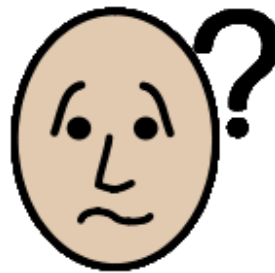
If you are from this area originally then you should be able to have your care and treatment here wherever possible if you want to.

Provider Collaborative/ PC

The 3 secure services in this area of the country are the Humber Centre, Stockton Hall and Clifton House. This simply means that these services are working together to help people get out of hospital quicker and get better community support. There are also community teams which are a key part of the PC—HTFT, LYPFT, Navigo and RDaSH.

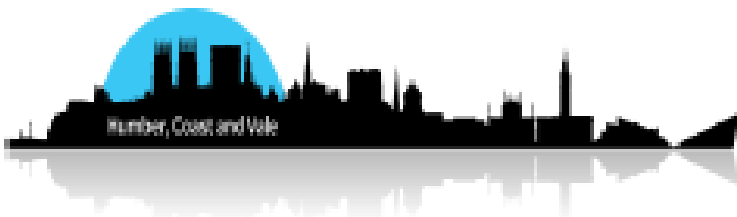
Fragmentation

This means that the care that is currently provided to people is not provided in the right way, so these changes need to address this.



Transformation/New Care Models

This means that there is a lot of work happening to change services to make them better, to make sure that people can be treated in their home area where possible, and to make sure that everyone has got a clear pathway out of hospital and back in to the community.
