

We visited the Yorkshire Wildlife Park and enjoyed a sunny day out walking around the park and marvelling at the animals.



"Co production Lead from the complex rehab project, Hollie Harkin has visited Waterloo Manor to talk to service users about their experience of hospital and how to make it a therapeutic environment as well as the importance of the therapeutic alliance between staff and service users. Some of the findings from our discussions with service users found that it was important that the hospital had a sensory room, a good Wi-Fi connection and having green spaces close by. It was also important for there to be multi-skilled staff presence on the wards and that staff were trauma informed."

CoProduction Meetings


- We run 'CoProduction meetings' with our service users.





- · The winning entry was a white chocolate and raspberry cheesecake


World Mental Health Day Charity Fun Walk/Run
